

## **Misdirected registration notice / electoral mails**

**Q1 I received a letter on voter registration / electoral mail to an unknown addressee. What should I do?**

A1 If you received a letter on voter registration / electoral mail to an unknown addressee, you may write “no such person” on the envelop and return it to us through Hongkong Post, or send a photo of the envelop to reoenq@reo.gov.hk. Upon receipt of the delivered letter, we will take appropriate follow up action.

**Q2 I suspect that some person used my particulars for fraudulent voter registration. What should I do?**

A2 You may provide the information to the Registration and Electoral Office. Upon receipt of your report, we will investigate into the case. If it is suspicious, we will refer it to the law enforcement agency for investigation and follow up. During the claims and objections period of a voter registration cycle, you may submit a notice of objection in person to us to object the registration of the person concerned. Your case will be handled by a Revising Officer. The period for claims and objections is as follows:

2021 :

Geographical Constituency and Functional Constituency : 26 September to 9 October  
Election Committee subsectors : 18 to 22 July

From 2022 voter registration cycle onwards : 1 to 25 August
